Transfer Articulation Agreement between Bunker Hill Community College and William James College from the Associate of Science degree in Human Services at BHCC to the Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology and Human Services at William James College. William James offers a fully online program as well as a blended program option. For information, see program website.

Date Established: Spring 2024

Eligibility:

- 1. Students must complete the Associate of Science degree in Human Services at BHCC with an overall grade point average of 2.5 or higher.
- 2. Students must have a minimum of 3 credits in English Composition and 3 credits in another humanities.
- 3. Students must meet all application requirements, including official transcripts from all previously attended institutions. Students do not need to submit an application fee, essay or letters of recommendation.
- 4. Students must receive a 'C-' or higher for a course to transfer. William James College will accept 60-90 transfer credits, which will apply toward Bachelor's degree completion.
- 5. Only courses numbered 100 or above are eligible for transfer. Student's may not transfer credits from remedial coursework.
