Our Mission

Deliver Information, Sustenance, and Health (DISH) to the Bunker Hill Community College (BHCC) campus community. The DISH aims to empower those in need to obtain resources so that they may focus on being healthy, happy, and successful at Bunker Hill Community College without the barrier of fighting hunger. The DISH is a student-driven and supported resource that is committed to being a safe, dignified, and stigma-free environment.

The DISH aspires to alleviate the barriers associated with food insecurity to support student success at Bunker Hill Community College and to ensure that no one goes hungry because of a lack of income or access to food.

The DISH Food Pantry serves current students, faculty, and staff at Bunker Hill Community College.

Milestones

Spring 2024

- Due to construction on the new Student Success Center (N-building) at BHCC, DISH had moved into a temporary space in 2023. In January, we were able to move back into our renovated space in room B-101.
- With funding from the Department of Higher Education through a Hunger Free Campus Grant, DISH was able to purchase our own cargo van! This van has been a gamechanger for our operations. The van allows our team to do large order and donation pickups around the Greater Boston area as well as deliver grocery orders and Grab & Go inventory to our Chelsea Campus.
- Also through the Hunger Free Campus Grant, we were able to purchase new equipment to outfit our DISH locations, including new reach-in refrigerators for two of our Grab & Go locations, allowing us to expand our breakfast offerings.

Summer 2024

• DISH continued our partnership with the Liberty Mutual Foundation, as they renewed their support with a \$150K grant over 3 years! This funding supports our Diaper Lottery program, and allows us to purchase diapers, baby food, baby products, and culturallyrelevant food items.

Fall 2024

- We celebrated the 5-Year Anniversary of the DISH Food Pantry at BHCC with a special on-campus event, bringing together community partners, donors, and supporters for a time of reflection and recognition.
- The **DISH Diaper Lottery** was established as a more equitable way to distribute diapers to our grocery program participants on a monthly basis.



Our Programs

Grocery Orders

DISH users can place orders online via SmartChoice for grocery items including pantry staples, fresh produce, hygiene and household products, culturally-relevant and allergen-friendly options, and baby products. Shoppers have the option of picking up their order in person at our pantry or in our DISH & Dash refrigerated lockers.

Our DISH & Dash lockers offer DISH users additional flexibility, privacy and dignity when picking up their orders.

In 2024, we served 715 households (up 29% from 2023) through our grocery program, filling 3,586 grocery orders (up 33% from 2023), which includes orders picked up inperson as well as in our refrigerated lockers on the Charlestown and Chelsea Campuses. We processed 1,212 new intake forms in 2024, a 35% increase from the previous year.

Diaper Lottery

In Fall 2024, DISH changed the way we distribute diapers. Previously, DISH users could order diapers via SmartChoice along with all other grocery items. However, we were seeing an uptick in demand for diapers and felt there could be a more equitable way to reach those in need. We moved to a Diaper Lottery system, which allows DISH users

to enter the lottery on a monthly basis. Based on our supply, we randomly select approximately 50 people to receive a box of diapers of their preferred size for that month. We prioritize those who did not receive diapers via the lottery during the prior month.



Grab & Go Locations

DISH operates 3 Grab & Go locations.

These locations include the Main Grab & Go office (B-101) on the Charlestown Campus, the G-Building Lounge on the 2nd Floor of the Charlestown Campus, and the Chelsea Campus Student Lounge (4th Floor). Items offered at our Grab & Go locations include snacks, drinks, frozen meals, fresh produce, bread products, pads and tampons, travel-size hygiene items, PPE, and miscellaneous grocery items.

DISH once again saw a significant increase in Grab & Go visits - from 2.516 visits in 2022. to 19,900 in 2023, to 35,809 visits in 2024! In just two years, DISH expanded from 1 to 3 Grab & Go locations, and our visits increased by 1,323%. Our busiest day recorded saw 448 students, faculty and staff members visit our Grab & Go locations, an increase of 63% from the previous year.

Heat-n-Eats Frozen Meal Program

Thanks to our longstanding partnership with Food For Free, DISH is able to offer healthy, frozen meals at all of our Grab & Go locations. In 2024, DISH distributed 12,660 frozen Heat-n-Eats meals to our BHCC community, an increase of 42% from 2023! These meals include meat, fish, and vegetarian options.

Overall Distribution

In 2024, we distributed a total of 95,659 pounds of food, hygiene and household items through our Grocery and Grab & Go programs. This is an increase of 37% over 2023. We purchased 20,328 pounds of product (up 117% from last year), equating to \$88,000 spent. This accounted for 21% of the total product we distributed in 2024.

Fall 2024 Feedback Survey Results

Survey Basics

- Distributed in January 2024 to DISH grocery program users as well as the entire BHCC community to reach Grab & Go users.
- The survey was addressed to those who had utilized DISH services during the Fall 2024 semester.
- 178 responses were received.

Visiting DISH

- 94% of respondents felt they were treated with dignity and respect and felt supported by DISH Food Pantry staff.
- 97% of respondents are "Extremely Likely" or "Very Likely" to recommend DISH to other students, faculty, and/or staff.

Quality of Product

- 86% of respondents rated the quality of food items received in their locker pick-up orders as "Excellent" or "Good."
- 88% of respondents rated the quality of food items received at Grab & Go as "Excellent" or "Good."

Impact

Frozen Meal Program

- 85% of respondents "Agreed" or "Strongly Agreed" that by having access to a frozen meal, they were able to focus on class or work-related activities better.
- 90% of respondents "Agreed" or "Strongly Agreed" that their stress/anxiety was lessened by having easy access to a nutritious meal.

Grocery Program

 89% of respondents were able to focus better on class or work-related activities by receiving items from the DISH grocery program. 85% of respondents were able to stay enrolled at BHCC by receiving items from the DISH grocery program.

Retention

• 91% of respondents plan to sign up for more classes at BHCC.

Opportunities for Improvement

- Some respondents expressed a desire for expanded hours at our Main Grab & Go location.
- Respondents noted how crowded and busy the Main Grab & Go location can get, making it difficult to access food.
 Suggestions were made to limit the number of people in the Grab & Go space at one time.
- There was a desire for more diverse food choices and more fresh produce over canned.
- Some respondents mentioned that having to wait 2 to 3 weeks from when they place their order to the next available pickup time is inconvenient.
- A common sentiment shared was that Grab & Go locations sometimes ran out of items like frozen meals and drinks and that inventory was often insufficient to meet the high demand.


